



## DEWHURST ST MARY C OF E PRIMARY



In 2011 the government gave a Pupil Premium grant to schools from central funding. The amount given to individual schools was based on free school meal numbers (FSM) and children who have been looked after (CLA). The grant is intended to be used by schools to enhance the educational outcomes for these children.

### PUPIL PREMIUM STATEMENT 2015/16

In 2015/16 the number of pupils eligible for FSM has decreased slightly from 41.9% to 40.2, however whole school numbers have increased.

Impact so far this year:

- Additional teachers enabling pupils to be taught in smaller groups focused on specific learning objectives to enable accelerated progress
- Interventions led by Teaching Assistants have meant targeted pupils making good progress.
- Clicker 6 programme to support literacy writing.
- ICT suite open before and after school for Lexia practice and homework completion for pupils not having access to computers at home.
- Educational visits, visitors and workshops enhance and enrich curriculum activities providing opportunities which are not generally available

### **Pupil Premium Pupils:**

- **Progress for this group of pupils in Year 6 in 2016 is above national in all areas and significantly above in mathematics.**
- **Attainment at the expected standard in reading is in line with national other and there is no significant difference in attainment in writing and mathematics.**
- **More middle prior attaining pupils reached greater depth in mathematics than did nationally and slightly less did so in reading, otherwise there are no significant differences at this standard.**
