Digital Journals Yrs 1-6 'Seesaw'

The app called 'Seesaw,' is used from year 1 to year 6. Up until now, pupils have been saving their evidence of learning in their subject portfolios and these are now available to also share with you. Seesaw creates a powerful learning loop between students, teachers, and families
