The programmes of study set out eight key areas which aim to enable pupils to develop knowledge and understanding of sources of wisdom and their impact whilst exploring personal and critical responses. Developing religious and theological literacy through religions and worldviews - permeates all areas of the programmes of study. The following eight key areas of RE may be taught in any order:

Belief and practices	Sources of wisdom	Symbols and actions	Prayer, worship and reflection

The Programmes of Study (pages 9-16) of the <u>Herts Agreed Syllabus</u> have been organised into a DSM Long Term Plan for RE with greater detail explained in DSM Medium Term Plans for Year R-6 each term. Each of the eight areas is highlighted in the planning as well as suggested questions and areas to develop learning which have been drawn from <u>Religion for Today and Tomorrow</u>. Understanding Christianity resources have been incorporated to continue to support the delivery of our school Christian education and ethos. Teachers will develop their own short-term plans which reflect the needs of their learners and are in line with assessment of their progress.

'Expected Learning Outcomes Wheels' for Assessment

'By end of...' key stage assessment statements and the expected outcomes for each of the eight areas of learning has been added to the DSM Medium Term Planning in order to allow teachers to focus on understanding 'what they want pupils to be able to understand and do as a result of their learning' as suggested in Religion for Today and Tomorrow-'Routes Into Learning. Teachers will annotate planning to keep a record of pupil progress and attainment in RE as well as reporting outcomes to subject leader, SLT and parents/carers. At the end of each half term teacher will complete a Pupil Assessment in RE to indicate if pupils are on track to gain age expected learning for their phase.
